Levels of Key Club The Member Club Officers

Key Club membership is open to anyone who wants to be a leader in their community and school by providing services to others.

Each member of Key Club must be willing to serve to their community and school.

Key Club officers are the student leaders of each club.
These officers help organize and work together as leaders in their individual schools. There are five roles an officer could have, which is the President, Vice-President, Secretary,
Treasurer, or Webmaster.

District Board

A student board of directors provides leadership within each Key Club district.
Each district board has a Governor, Secretary,
Webmaster and Bulletin Editor. And in addition, districts are divided into divisions, and each division is led by a Lieutenant Governor (LTG).

International

Key Club is led at the international level by Key Club international officers. Officers include the President, Vice-President, and 11 International Trustees. Each Trustee is responsible for serving as the liaison between the Key Club International Board and three Key Club districts. The Key Club International Board and all the District Governors comprise the International Council.

BUILDER'S CLUB



A service organization for middle school students that encourages community involvement and leadership skills at an early age. Builders Clubs are typically sponsored by local Kiwanis clubs.

The elementary school level of the Kiwanis Family, K-Kids introduces young students to the values of service, teamwork, and leadership through ageappropriate projects and club activities.

Bracelet Sale


Create and sell friendship bracelets at school events or lunches. It's easy, customizable, and people love wearable support!
