#### District Growth and Participation

Additionally, we'll highlight various scholarships offered by Key Club International and Kiwanis, ensuring that members are aware of the opportunities available to them.

#### **District Connections**

This year, I am committed to strengthening the bond within our district. The Lieutenant Governors will host three online divisional council meetings, allowing members to interact directly with the district board and engage with others in their area. They are dedicated to ending the global water crisis by building freshwater wells in communities that lack access to safe, clean drinking water. To support this life-changing mission, our clubs will be fundraising throughout the year. We're also challenging every single club to host a Water Walk: a 3.75-mile walk representing the average distance women and children must travel daily to collect clean water. Our district fundraising goal is \$2,000 to help end the global water crisis. Every \$25 you raise gives one person clean water for life!
